The Star Chamber (Latin Camera stellata) was an English court of law that sat at the royal Palace of Westminster until 1641. It was made up of Privy Counsellors, as well as common-law judges, and supplemented the activities of the common-law and equity courts in both civil and criminal matters. The court was set up to ensure the fair enforcement of laws against prominent people, those so powerful that ordinary courts could never convict them of their crimes. Court sessions were held in secret, with no indictments, no right of appeal, no juries, and no witnesses. Evidence was presented in writing. Over time it evolved into a political weapon and became a symbol of the misuse and abuse of power by the English monarchy and courts. . . . In modern usage, legal or administrative bodies with strict, arbitrary rulings and secretive proceedings are sometimes called, metaphorically or poetically, star chambers.

Unlike the medieval Star Chamber, which became an instrument of taxation under Henry VII, and a symbol of arbitrary justice under the Stuarts, the WAY 'Star Chamber' is a force for good. It follows many of the principles of the original such as being held in secret, with no witnesses, no published minutes and no published quotes.

The WAY Star Chamber has '8 wise men' as members and operates in a confidential manner existing for the benefit of its own members. It offers the opportunity for open debate with private and unreported discussions among 8 independently-minded peers about a subject that they all share a passion for – and to do so on a regular monthly basis (thereby getting to know each other well in the process). It is quite different to members having their own internal company meetings where their corporate culture, approach, processes and experiences may dominate.

WAY does not publish any detail directly from the Chamber and nor does it market anything other than its existence or that it operates in a confidential manner with no published minutes or opinions given. It is an internal mechanism, the sole purpose of which is to add substantial value to WAY's investment process (see separate factsheet). The current members of the Star Chamber are:
